School Council Elections


It's time of year again to renew the membership of our School Council. This year, we have vacancies for six parent members and one staff member. Nomination information will be sent out via Compass.

Enrolment Policy

The updated enrolment policy can be found on the Northern School for Autism website at https://www.northernautism.vic.edu.au/policies-protocols. A reminder: students are entitled to 13 years of schooling. Therefore, students will graduate from Northern School for Autism after their 13th year of schooling or the year they turn 18, whichever comes first. Students who begin their schooling in another setting are still entitled to a total of 13 years of schooling. For example, a student starting at NSA in Year 2 will only have 11 years of schooling with us, as they have already completed 2 years at another school.





Welcome Back To School!



This free* interpreting service is available for parents and carers to communicate key information about their child's education. This service is available Monday to Friday, between 8:30am and 6:00pm.

The telephone numbers and languages listed below are designed for parents and carers to call a school.

- Step 1. Have the phone number of the school service ready to give to the interpreter.
- Step 2. Find your language in the list below.
- Step 3. Use the phone number for your language to connect with an interpreter.
- Step 4. Tell the interpreter the name and phone number of the school.
- **Step 5.** The interpreter will call the number you have provided and connect you with the school.
- Step 6. The interpreter will stay on the call and interpret until you're finished.
