FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hello Families,

Can you believe we've passed the halfway mark of Term 1? Time certainly flies when we're having fun! We're so proud of how well all our students have settled into their routines, especially our new foundation students, who are now attending five full days each week.

Welcome to Country

I would like to thank Andrea Wallace, who worked with Corey Wanganeen, our Koorie Engagement Support Officer, to organise a Welcome to Country at the Reservoir and Lalor campuses.

First Aid and CPR

Over the past month, a number of staff across the school have completed Emergency First Aid and CPR training. These staff members are now fully trained to support students and each other in an emergency.

School Nurse

A school nurse has been employed and will be based at the Reservoir Campus. When we move into the new building at the Lalor Campus, we will employ a school nurse who will be based there as well.

Late arrival and Early leave

It is important that students are at school for the full six hours a day. Arriving late and leaving early is very disruptive for the classroom and will take one staff member out of the classroom which will impact the teaching and learning programs. Parents who are collecting students early or arriving late will need to be prepared to wait until a staff is available to transition your child.

CSEF

The Camps, Sports, and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities.

The applicant must be one of the following on the first day of Term 1 (28 January 2025) or Term 2 (22 April 2025):

- A parent or carer who is the beneficiary of a financially means-tested card (please refer to the list of eligible cards below).
- A student over 16 years who is considered a mature minor and holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card). For guidance on assessing whether a student is a mature minor, refer to the department's policy on Mature Minors and Decision Making.
- A parent or carer whose child is 16 or over and the beneficiary of a financially means-tested card but is not considered a mature minor.

Applications must be submitted to the school by 4 July 2025.

Where the parent or carer is seeking eligibility based on an eligible financially means-tested card, eligibility will be determined when the relevant concession card successfully validates with Centrelink on either the first day of Term 1 or Term 2.

For students over 16 years of age and where the eligible card is in the name of the student, the fund is only granted to that student, not their siblings.

If a school or family is unsure if the concession card is eligible, they are encouraged to submit the application to the CSEF system for validation.

The full list of eligible concession and health care cards is available on the <u>Services Australia</u> website. For Veterans' Affairs, gold cards are the only means-tested cards accepted. This card must be sighted, and a photocopy taken by the school to confirm the expiry date and eligibility.

Cards that are not financially tested are not accepted.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a registered Victorian school.

CSEF is not payable to a student attending pre-school, kindergarten, TAFE, or who is home-schooled.

A special consideration category exists for asylum seeker families and families on temporary protection or Safe Haven visas who are not permanent residents and do not have access to Centrelink or a Health Care Card. Permanent residents or applicants with a Health Care Card are not eligible for special consideration. Applicants' VISA Grant Notice details showing their current residential status are required to apply for special consideration.

Applicants who have a Health Care Card issued by Centrelink should apply as a general application and not under special consideration.

For students in temporary out-of-home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care or foster care, a letter of support from the institution facilitating the arrangement (e.g., Mackillop Family Services) or the Department of Families, Fairness, and Housing (DFFH) is required as evidence and must be no more than 12 months old. Copies of court orders are permitted to support special consideration applications.

Permanent care arrangements such as permanent visas and foster care do not meet the criteria for special consideration.

Only one application for each student can be submitted per year. Parents/carers must decide which parent/carer should apply. If the parents/carers are unable to decide who should utilise the CSEF, the first eligible application entered and approved in the system will receive the payment.

LC8 has started the year with a range of activities and outings.


This has included our local walks within the community, Interschool Sports, STEAM, P.E. and Aert Therapy.


The staff are pleased with the group's ability to listen to each other's needs and practice understanding each other so we can have fun, learn new skills, explore and meet and work with new staff respectfully.

"Respect for ourselves and each other".








SCIENCE INCURSION - HEAT AND ENERGY
