Term 2 has been an exciting one for all Room 9 students and staff!































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Senior Student Work Experience at Whittlesea City Conservation



Lalor Students STEAM Visit to Quantum Victoria

Students from LC8 & LC9 paid a visit to Quantum Victoria on Monday, June 17th. During the visit, they were introduced to TinkerCAD, a design program. Engaging in different challenges, the students eventually created their own bag tags. It was impressive to witness them applying the skills they acquired in class within the community, displaying patience, cooperation, and inquisitiveness. Now, they will utilize these newfound skills to design and print various objects back in the classroom.

A group of Year 11 and 12 students has recently started their Work Experience at The City of Whittlesea Conservation Centre. This annual program with the Whittlesea council includes activities such as:

- Preparing planters for seeds
- Cleaning planter pots for planting seedlings
- Sugaring areas
- · Weeding areas
- Pressing flowers for a conservation diary
- Spreading grass seed
- Documenting animal sightings in a conservation diary

To ensure their safety and that of others, students wear high-visibility vests or long-sleeve tops and are cautious in handling tools.
