It is a time to celebrate that Australia is one of the most successful multicultural societies in the world. It is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values. Building on over 65,000 years of First Nations cultures, Australia has become home to migrants from nearly 300 different ancestries. LALOR STEAM NEWS

Wow... Is Term One really finished already? It has certainly been a challenging beginning to the year with limited spaces while the new building is under construction. Nonetheless, students have enthusiastically adapted to the changes and are discovering various ways to engage in STEAM until we transition to our new space next term... how exciting!

Students are still enjoying OSMO, a beloved tool in the STEAM community. The OSMO utilizes a mirror positioned on the iPad's front-facing camera, allowing the apps to recognize objects placed in front of the device. Each game features items that interact with the iPad, whether through tiles for spelling words or solving simple math problems. By drawing on a whiteboard, users can have their creations integrated into the game. Additionally, there are unique coding pieces designed to teach children fundamental coding sequences, helping to familiarize them with STEAM projects.

Other engaging activities for students at the Lalor Campus feature magnets and the exploration of forces, as well as using BeeBots, Dash, and Sphero Robots for coding and obstacle navigation. These activities enable every student to participate in coding, regardless of their starting skill level.
